**Community Schools Support** - Supporting network and non-profit agency linkages

**Anaheim Intersections Initiative** - Promoting racial equity in education

**Human Services Network** - Serves as a networking platform for sharing information and resources to strengthen the overall provision of services and support to Anaheim youth, families, older adults, and neighborhood environments and includes:

- **Feed Anaheim** - Addressing food insecurity and grocery rescue
- **Accessibility** - Support Adults & Youth with Developmental Disabilities
- **Health & Medical Supports** - Coordinating health and wellness
- **ACT Anaheim** – Supporting youth ages 12–18
- **Anaheim Religious Council** - bringing faith-based organizations together
- **Family Services & Older Adults** - Coordinating supportive services
- **Employment Development “Workforce Development”**
- **Education** - Connecting 7 school districts
- **Resident Engagement** - Building a network of 34+ Community Captains across neighborhoods
